

# **COVID-19 SITUATION REPORT**

#### **Situation Update**

#### **KEY HIGHLIGHTS**

- Six (6) new COVID-19 confirmed cases have been reported in the last 24 hours bringing the cumulative total of COVID-19 confirmed cases in Uganda to 1,006. No COVID-19 related death has been registered to date.
- Seventeen (17) non-Ugandan truck drivers tested positive for COVID-19 and were not allowed entry into the country.
- A total of 219 confirmed cases (195 Ugandans; 21 non-Ugandans; 3 refugees) are currently admitted across 15 health facilities and a cumulative total of 938 patients have recovered and been discharged.
- Sixty-one percent (613/1,006) are imported cases and 39% are locally transmitted (393/1,006).
- A total of 2,048 laboratory samples were tested today bringing it to a cumulative total of 221,675 samples tested.
- A cumulative total of 12,808 contacts (2,736 still under follow up) have been listed to date, 10,072 (78%) of whom have completed the mandatory 14-day follow up period and been discharged from daily follow up.


#### 2. Public Health Actions

#### SURVEILLANCE




## Trend of COVID-19 cases by date of lab confirmation



Gender distribution of confirmed cases




# Distribution of locally transmitted cases by district of sample collection (n=393)

### 3. Challenges

- Lack of institutional quarantine sites in Kyotera district which is reporting high numbers of local transmission.
- There is no waiting area for truck drivers at Mutukula POE after testing.
- Stock out of IPC supplies; Gowns, N95 Face Masks.
- CTUs are understaffed, with too much work shared among nurses and doctors.
- Need to increase psychosocial support to both the patients and staff to address the ever-



increasing stigma and trauma associated with COVID-19.

- Delayed availability of transport for recovered people to resettle them back to their communities.
- Isolation units have run out of funds to support meals for cases in admission and also lack fuel to repatriate foreigners.
- Isolation units lack beds and mattresses, beddings for those with expanded admission capacity.

### 4. Conclusion

The Ministry of Health in collaboration with other government ministries, agencies and departments and districts continues to strengthen the COVID-19 outbreak response mechanisms.
